- The Your Way Home Montgomery County public-private partnership improves the housing stability, economic security and health of people experiencing or at imminent risk of homelessness.
- Our vision is to make the experience of homelessness in Montgomery County rare, brief and non-recurring.

Advancing a Unified Housing Crisis Response System





RARE: 279 at-risk households (73%) have been diverted from entering homeless shelters in 2016.




Total number of households that have been provided diversion (Housing Counseling) service: 258 (2015), 351 (2016).


BRIEF:

The average length of stay in shelter was 58 days for single adults and 63 days for families in 2016.



The percentage of families exiting directly to permanent housing from shelter increased to 70%; single adults increased to 40% in 2016.

Percent of exits directly from shelter to permanent housing




Families N= Number of people in families exiting shelters: 398 (2013), 437 (2014), 376 (2015), 300 (2016). Single Adults N= Number of single adults exiting shelters: 296 (2013), 377 (2014), 335 (2015), 245 (2016).

NON- RECURRING: 4% of persons exiting to permanent housing have returned to

homelessness since 2014.

Adults in Rapid Re-Housing increasing total income	51% (of 385)	60% (of 580)	61% (of 509)
Adults in Rapid Re-Housing increasing earned income	23% (of 371)	28% (of 566)	32% (of 498)
Adults in Rapid Re-Housing connected to public benefits by program exit	81% (of 158)	90% (of 388)	94% (of 233)
All clients exiting to permanent housing from Rapid Re-Housing program	81% (of 217)	72% (of 610)	70% (of 351)






