"Provide and promote collaboration at all levels of Government and across all sectors to inspire and energize Americans to commit to preventing and ending homelessness."

- Good planning is inclusive



- Use of By-Name List




- What are community needs and available resources.

Staying Power

How many Veterans rapidly re-housed by SSVF re-entered homelessness within 2 years?

- 26% of individuals
- 15.5% of families

This is consistent with experience that some need episodic assistance.

Two Missions Becoming One

Rapidly re-house homeless Veterans and their families Prevention – keep those imminently atrisk, housed



What We Can Build

Data is our friend and allows us to

- Understand available resources and plan how it can meet demand
- 2. Prioritize services to match need
- Reduce delays to housing placement (put the rapid in rapid re-housing)
- 4. As communities approach zero, allows for rational reallocation to prevention
