

People Experiencing Homelessness ARE Eligible for Stimulus Payments

What You Can Do:

1

Make sure all people using your services know they are entitled to Economic Impact Payments. To identify eligible individuals, start the conversation during case management visits, shelter intake, coordinated entry, and outreach services.

2

Remind clients that if they didn't receive a payment in 2020, they must file a tax return to claim the third round payment. Filing also allows them to apply for a Recovery Rebate Credit of up to \$1,800 if they didn't receive a previous stimulus payment.

3

Identify partners that can help clients file their taxes:

- Become familiar with options for free online filing help for low income individuals.
- Use the IRS' "[Free Tax Prep Help](#)" resource to identify participating providers in the IRS Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) and the Tax Counseling for the Elderly (TCE) programs.
- Reach out now to volunteers, pro bono partners, or others who may be able to assist your clients with tax filings.
