Now homeless response systems must reexamine and restrengthen its efforts by coordinating and ensuring fidelity to best practices in the interventions offered.

### WHY STRONGER TOGETHER?

Creating An Effective Homeless Response System



#### GOAL OF AN EFFECTIVE, EFFICIENT, AND EQUITABLE HOMELESS RESPONSE SYSTEM

**DIVERT** people from imminent homelessness whenever possible

**HOUSE** people as quickly as possible





#### HOMELESS RESPONSE SYSTEM: ENDGAME

HOMELESSNESS IS RARE, BRIEF, AND ONE-TIME



People in a housing crisis have access to immediate help, including a safe place to go



People are not unsheltered



People do not spend long periods of time homeless



People exit homelessness quickly and do not quickly cycle back into homelessness



#### HOMELESS RESPONSE SYSTEM: ENDGAME

#### ESTABLISH SYSTEM PERFORMANCE MEASURES

Reduce in-flow into homelessness

An efficient and coordinated process that moves people from homelessness to housing as quickly as possible






