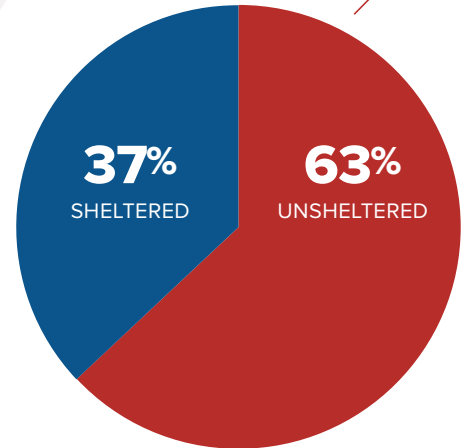
While **2,478** HI residents were permanently housed last year,

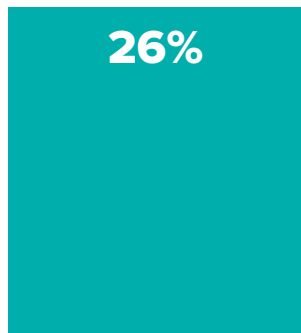

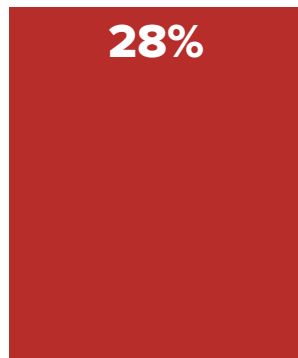

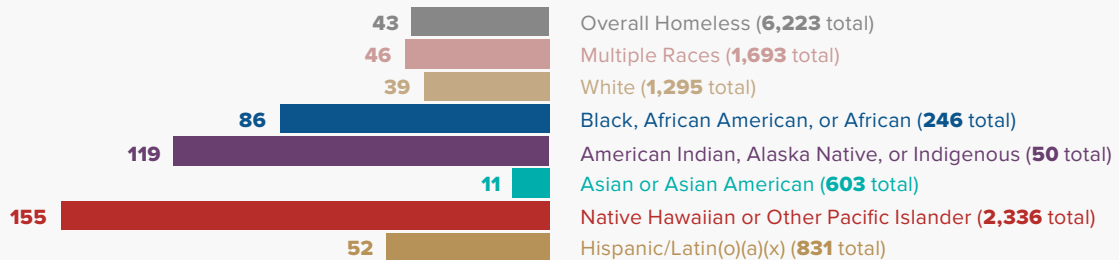
