Dear Chair Schatz and Ranking Member Hyde-Smith:

As you develop the Fiscal Year (FY) 2025 Transportation, Housing and Urban Development Appropriations bill, we urge your continued support for the Department of Housing and Urban Development's (HUD) homeless assistance programs. Specifically, we urge you to provide: 1) at least \$4.75 billion for McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Grants (HAG), including at least \$500 million for Emergency Solutions Grants, 2) at least \$34.5 billion for Tenant-Based "Section 8" Rental Assistance (TBRA), and 3) consistent funding for HUD's Veterans Affairs Supportive Housing Program (HUD-VASH).

Home prices and rents have far out-paced average wage gains over the past four years and led to a rapid rise in the number of unhoused Americans. According to HUD's 2023 Annual Homelessness Assessment Report to Congress, more individuals were experiencing homelessness on a single night in January 2023 than any year since this reporting began in 2007. Year-to-year, over 70,000 more individuals were experiencing homelessness in 2023 – a 12 percent increase.

Robust funding for HAG and TBRA will help more families weather increased housing costs and quickly connect people experiencing homelessness back to a home with essential wraparound services. Indeed, HAG programs are proven, long-term solutions to the homelessness crisis that use the "Housing First" model, a concept first adopted by the George W. Bush Administration that helps communities avoid costs associated with homelessness, lessening the burdens on law enforcement and emergency health care providers. These funds will also help ensure service providers have the funding they need to hire and retain experienced staff to execute effective homelessness assistance strategies and best serve unhoused individuals and families.

Finally, we must also maintain our long-standing investment in HUD-VASH, which assists veterans who are homeless and their families in finding and sustaining permanent housing. Unfortunately, veterans, including those who served in Iraq and Afghanistan, continue to be at high risk of homelessness due to their elevated incidence of mental and physical injuries. We must do all that we can to ensure that those who have bravely served our country do not then find themselves without a home.

Thank you for your consideration of these requests and we look forward to working with you on the FY 2025 Transportation, Housing and Urban Development Appropriations bill.
