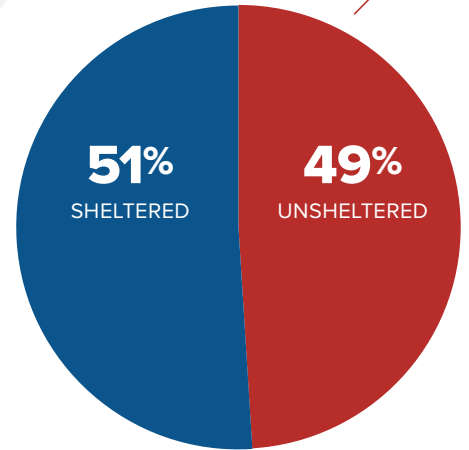
While **6,696** TN residents were permanently housed last year,

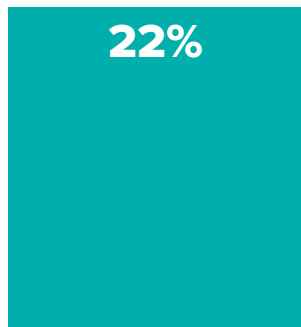

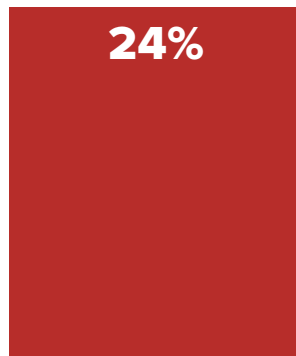

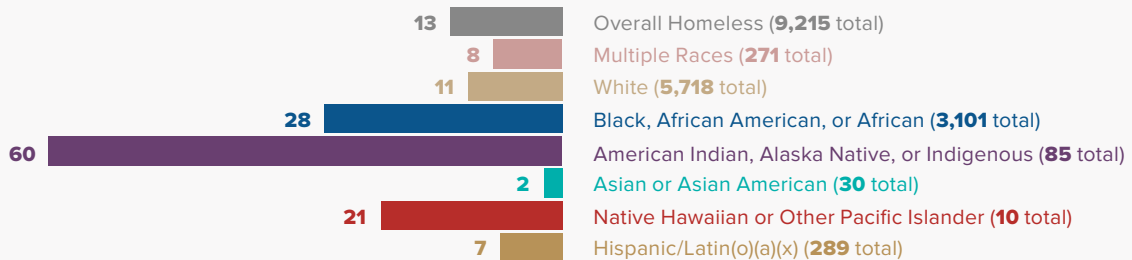
