



## Homelessness 2024 Election Survey

Among 2,202 U.S. adults

— OCTOBER 2024



### **Project Overview**

#### **OBJECTIVES**

- To understand how concerned Americans' are about homelessness.
- Determine how much of an impact a candidate's stance on homelessness will have at the ballot box.
- Assess which approaches and policies Americans' prefer when it comes to addressing homelessness.

#### **METHODOLOGY**

This poll was conducted between September 27-September 28, 2024 among a sample of 2,202 Adults. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of Adults based on age, gender, race, educational attainment, region, gender by age, and race by educational attainment.

Results from the full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 2 to 3 percentage points depending on the audience.


### **Key Takeaways**

- Homelessness is a major and bipartisan concern for Americans.
- The stance candidates take on homelessness could have a major impact on elections, and this is true at all levels.
- Across the political spectrum, Americans want policies that focus on getting people housed over punitive sweeps and bans.
- Knowing that this approach has worked at greatly reducing homelessness among the veteran community, Americans want the same approach for all, and they want to tap into Federal funds to implement such policies.

Homelessness and affordable housing are some of the most major concerns Americans have, and this sentiment is non-partisan.


How concerned, if at all, are you about each of the following issues?




### IMPACT ON VOTING

Regardless of party, most feel that a candidate's stance on homelessness is one of, if not the, most important factor in determining their vote. A candidate's stance on homelessness is no less critical than their stance on housing affordability.

How does a candidate's emphasis on solving homelessness/affordable housing compare to other issues (e.g., the economy, healthcare, jobs) in determining your vote?






### IMPACT ON VOTING

A candidate is far more likely to be helped than hurt by making homelessness policies a priority. Across both parties, very few would be turned off a candidate for this reason.

How likely are you, if at all, to vote for a candidate who prioritizes policy solutions for homelessness?




### IMPACT ON VOTING

In the upcoming November 2024 election, which of the following candidates are you more likely to support at each level?


- A candidate who supports policies focused on providing housing and services to help individuals transition out of homelessness

# Despite the vast amount of progress made in reducing veteran homelessness, few Americans are aware of how much has been accomplished.



# There is strong bipartisan support for using federal dollars and taking the same approach that has worked with the veteran population for the entire homeless population.






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### **OPTIMISM FOR PROGRESS**

How confident are you that homelessness will decrease in the next year among each of the following?




