



Every One Votes: Gathering the Information Your Clients Will Need

Your clients will need a lot of information to get them set up to vote. But you don't need to find it all yourself. A quick call to your state or local election office can provide you with the following information:

- ✓ Guidelines for registering voters.
- ✓ Guidelines and rules for assisting clients with registration, including handling and submitting registration forms and completing registrations online.
- ✓ Voter registration forms and confirmation of the Web address for online registration.
- ✓ Eligibility, address, and identification requirements.
- ✓ Registration deadlines, including whether your state has same day registration and voting. This will be helpful in planning your efforts to register clients to vote.
- ✓ Your state's voting by mail and/or absentee voting policies and any requisites or deadlines to such voting.
- ✓ Locations of in-person polling places, ballot drop boxes, etc.
