

## Youth Outcomes at Baseline & Follow up

### Cohort 3 Survey Participation<sup>2</sup>



This graph displays the number of youth who were eligible to take the survey and the number who participated. Survey data are displayed for age 17, 19, and 21. Age 17: eligible 24,474 and participated 16,254, resulting in a participation percentage of 66%.

Age 19: eligible 11,956 and participated 8,912, resulting in a participation percentage of 75%. Age 21: eligible 11,831 and participated 7,780, resulting in a participation percentage of 66%.
