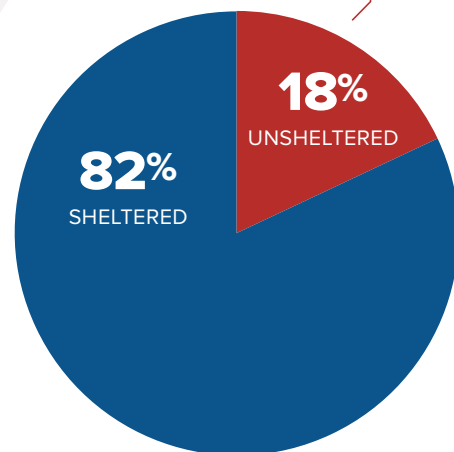
While **1,248** AK residents were permanently housed last year,

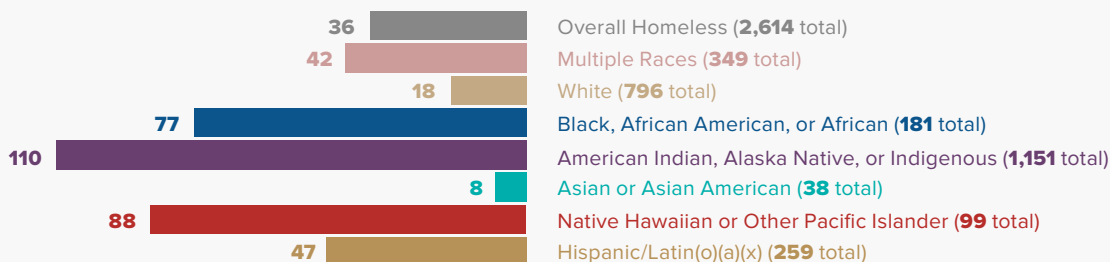
