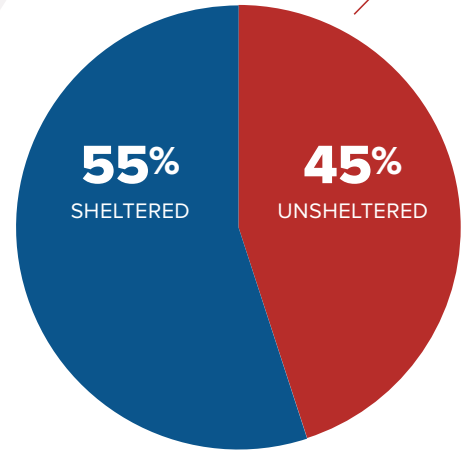
While **1,683** MS residents were permanently housed last year,

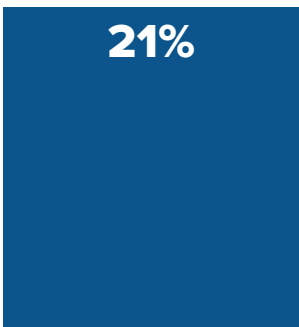

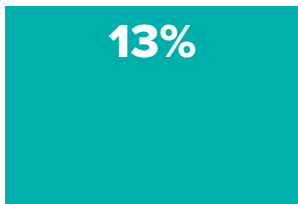

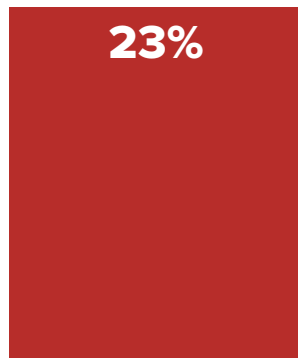

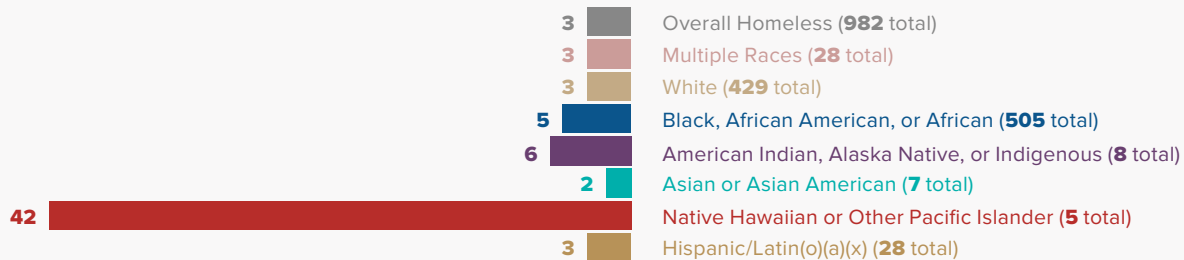
