

BUILDING AN EFFECTIVE AND EQUITABLE HOMELESS RESPONSE SYSTEM

Communities who have successfully reduced homelessness emphasize the importance of ensuring their homeless response system is effective, efficient, and equitable. Achieving this goal involves preventing homelessness before it happens—and swiftly providing housing if it does—through safe and appropriate interventions, all while preserving the dignity and resilience of those facing housing crises. In addition to the curated resources linked below, communities should take the following into consideration:

Establishing a Continuum of Care (CoC) board composition and structure that includes:

- Racial and ethnic diversity reflective of the community
- Cross-system decision makers, including nontraditional partners
- People with lived experience of homelessness

Using data to assess disparities, measure success, and guide funding decisions. This should include public-facing data.

Ensuring transparency in all aspects of decision making to ensure accountability
