WHY STRONGER TOGETHER?

Creating An Effective Homeless Response System

GOAL OF AN EFFECTIVE, EFFICIENT, AND EQUITABLE HOMELESS RESPONSE SYSTEM

DIVERT people from imminent homelessness whenever possible

HOUSE people as quickly as possible





HOMELESS RESPONSE SYSTEM: ENDGAME

HOMELESSNESS IS RARE, BRIEF, AND ONE-TIME



People in a housing crisis have access to immediate help, including a safe place to go



People are not unsheltered



People do not spend long periods of time homeless



People exit homelessness quickly and do not quickly cycle back into homelessness



HOMELESS RESPONSE SYSTEM: ENDGAME

ESTABLISH SYSTEM PERFORMANCE MEASURES



Reduce in-flow into homelessness



Increase exits to permanent housing



Decrease average length of homelessness



Decrease returns to homelessness

Coordinated Entry

Emergency Shelter

Rapid Re-Housing

Transitional Housing

Permanent Supportive Housing



INCREASE SYSTEM FLOW

An efficient and coordinated process that moves people from homelessness to housing as quickly as possible






Consider How Current Resources Are Being Utilized and Working Together...

RAPID RE-HOUSING

A Proven Approach to Ending Homelessness

Rapid Re-Housing Works!

Moves people into housing quickly!

Exits the majority of households to permanent housing.

Is a key part of a functional homelessness response system!

Programming flexes to meet diverse needs of participants.

Can serve more people overall than other permanent housing interventions available.



Rapid Re-Housing Innovations & Strategy

Belief in people makes all the difference!

Consolidate admin to support smaller & non-traditional programs Employ people with lived expertise at all levels of the program

Support and encourage shared housing as a viable and affordable option

Creative partnerships enhance services and grow resources


Effective landlord engagement = building lasting relationships
