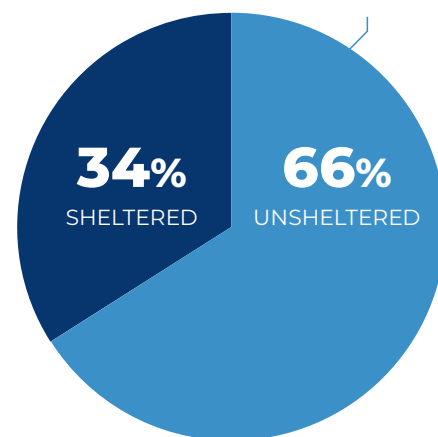
While **42,749** CA residents were permanently housed last year,
