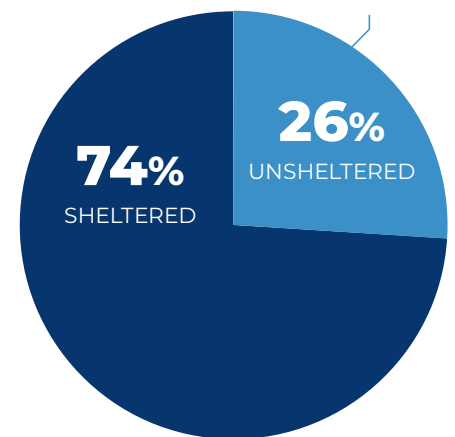
While **4,514** CO residents were permanently housed last year,
