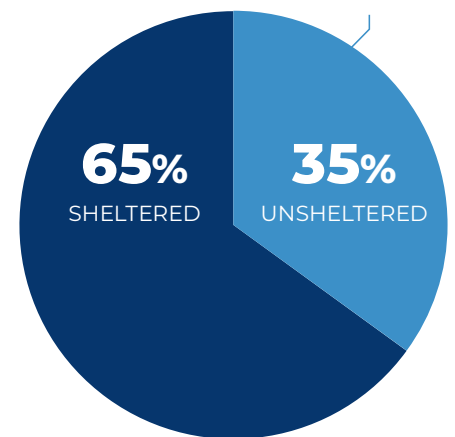
While **2,520** HI residents were permanently housed last year,
