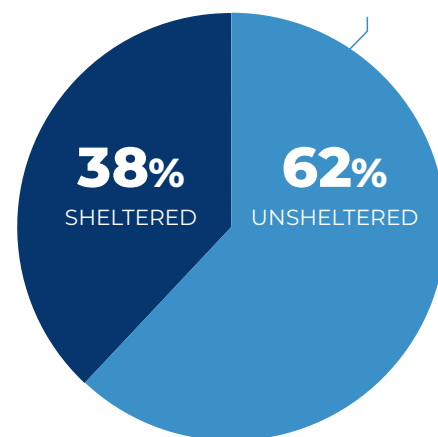
While **6,853** OR residents were permanently housed last year,
