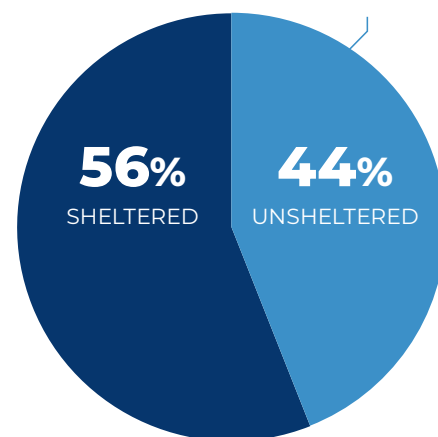
While **16,049** TX residents were permanently housed last year,
