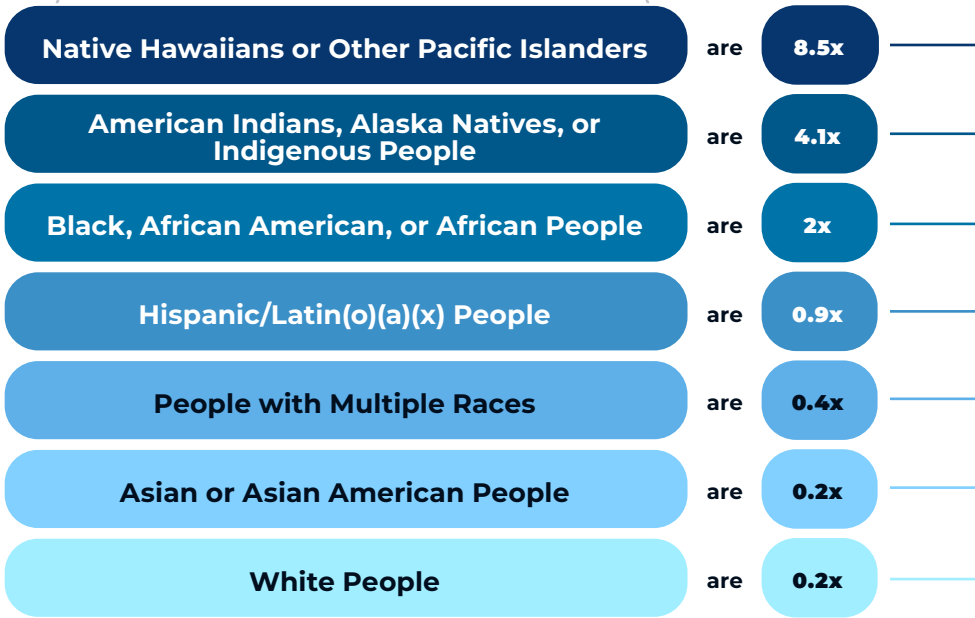


**HOMELESSNESS

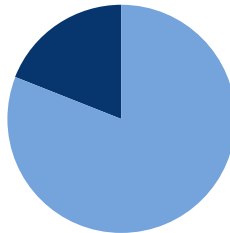

POPULATION.**



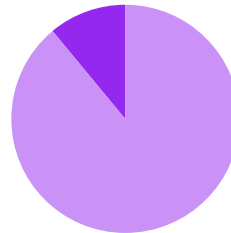
SOME GENDERS EXPERIENCE

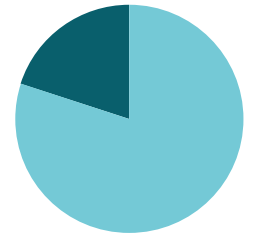
