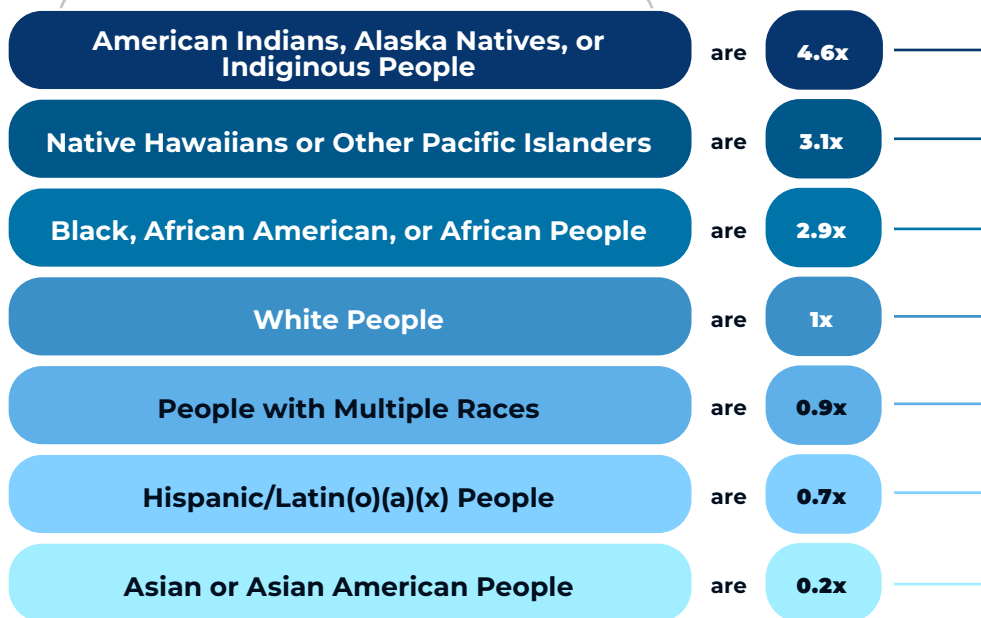


**HOMELESSNESS

People who identify as:

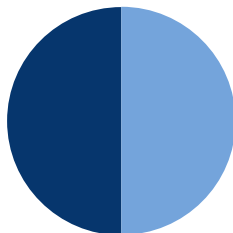


AS LIKELY TO EXPERIENCE HOMELESSNESS IN TEXAS COMPARED TO THE STATE'S GENERAL POPULATION.

49.7% are unsheltered



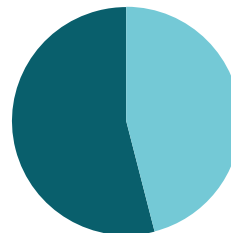
MEN

Recurring homelessness among **PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES** continues to rise in response to a shortage of accessible, affordable housing units.

HOMELESSNESS IN **RURAL AREAS** REVEAL DISPARITIES SUCH AS:



Highest percentages of **PEOPLE UNSHELTERED** within their communities (31 percent).



Highest percentage of unsheltered **INDIVIDUALS IN CHRONIC SITUATIONS.**

SOLVING HOMELESSNESS FOR ALL PEOPLE in the United States will require us to account for groups who have been excluded, systems that don't work for everyone, and outcomes that are unfair along geography, gender, age, sexual orientation, disability, race, and other demographics.
