

HOMELESSNESS DISPARITIES IN

WYOMING

9.3 out of every 10,000 WY residents are experiencing homelessness. However, this trauma is not felt equally across populations in the state.

People who identify as:

Black, African American, or African People

are 7.7x

American Indians, Alaska Natives, or Indigenous People

are 3.8x

Hispanic/Latin(o)(a)(x) People

are 1.2x

White People

are 0.9x

People with Multiple Races

are 0.5x

Asian or Asian American People

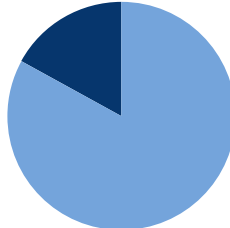

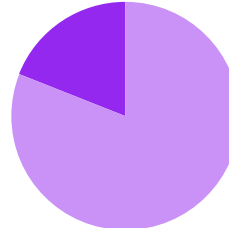
SOME GENDERS EXPERIENCE

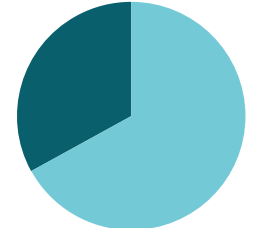

Recurring homelessness among **PEOPLE WITH DISABILITIES** continues to rise in response to a shortage of accessible, affordable housing units.

Highest percentages of **PEOPLE UNSHELTERED** within their communities (31 percent).



Highest percentage of unsheltered **INDIVIDUALS IN CHRONIC SITUATIONS**.

SOLVING HOMELESSNESS FOR ALL PEOPLE in the United States will require us to account for groups who have been excluded, systems that don't work for everyone, and outcomes that are unfair along geography, gender, age, sexual orientation, disability, race, and other demographics.
